A regular meeting of the Seward County Board of Commissioners was convened in open and public session at 8:30 a.m. on April 1, 2025 in the Commissioner's room at the Seward County Courthouse. Notice of the meeting was posted on the Courthouse bulletin board, on the Commissioner's Room door, on the Seward County website: sewardcountyne.gov and published in the Seward County Independent and the Milford Times. The agenda for all meetings is kept continually current and is available for public inspection at the County Clerk's Office during normal business hours. The agenda is held open until one business day prior to the meeting for appearance before the Board. The Board of Commissioners has the right to modify the agenda to include items of an emergency nature only at such public meeting.

The Chairperson noted that the public meeting information is posted as required by law and available for public distribution if requested.

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Jonathan Jank, Executive Director of Seward County Chamber & Development Partnership (SCCDP), updated the Commissioners on events of his organization.

Marilyn Hladky and Sherry Schweitzer updated the Commissioners on activities of their offices.

Moved by Hain and seconded by Zabrocki to approve the consent agenda consisting of:

Commissioners Reports:

Commissioner Hain reported information about services for mental health for inmates, assisted with a Road Dept. lunch in thanking them for their help during the storm, shared information about a piece of real estate owned by the county in a village, worked with BRIDGES about grants, re-sent the survey related to the juvenile services, received a lot of comments about road conditions after the recent storm, attended the ribbon cutting ceremony for the new City of Seward Wellness Center, met with Sheriff Vance, the County Attorney and Commissioner Pekarek about an upcoming agenda item.

Commissioner Zabrocki reported he worked on employee reviews, gathered data about the storm damage and followed up on potential risks with the Nebraska Intergovernmental Risk Management Assn. (NIRMA) about any liability Seward County would have with the Sheriff Posse.

Commissioner Ahmic reported she attended a ribbon cutting for Main Street Market in Milford, had a meeting with the Nebraska Intergovernmental Risk Management Assn. (NIRMA) Rep, and attended the Road Dept. Lunch. She is working on a Veteran of the Month article, attended the Seward/Saline Solid Waste Meeting, asked to join a Nebraska Association of County Officials (NACO) Committee, spoke with the Assessor about tax exemptions for nursing homes, met with the Highway Supt. about dust control on roads, gathered information about storm damage, received request from NextLink for support for a project that they will inform the Commissioners about at a later date.

Commissioner Schmieding reported he will have an Extension Board meeting and had discussions with various constituents.

Commissioner Pekarek reported he met with the Veterans Service Officer, will meet with the Veterans Service Committee at a later date, discussed with constituents about storm damage, met with Commissioner Hain, the County Attorney and Sheriff on a county matter, reached out to the Nebraska Dept. of Roads on road issues, and talked to a representative at the Nebraska Emergency Management Agency about storm damage reporting.

The bid will be awarded in two weeks.

There was discussion of future funding for the remainder of 420th road paving. Commissioner Hain led discussion about the grants received and grants denied. She met with NDOT about future funding. The project is estimated to be \$4 Million dollars short. Hain stated that there needs to be a plan about funding. She stated she received many complaints about it these past weeks since the storm. She stated the road is used by many residents. Discussion was held about using the Inheritance Fund, and if the State of Nebraska might help with funding and contacting our representatives in Congress and the Senate.

Carol Albrecht representing the Farmers Market vendors was present to request the use of the courthouse lawn for the Farmers Market this summer.

Moved by Zabrocki and seconded by Schmieding to approve holding Farmers Market on the courthouse lawn from May 17, 2025 to October 29, 2025 including use of power outlets controlled by the county.

Upon review of all necessary facts, the County Commissioners make the following findings:
1. X The use, in all other respects, conforms to the applicable regulations of the district in which it is located.
2. X The use will have adequate water and sewer facilities.
3. X The use will be in harmony with the character of the area and the most appropriate use of the land.
4. X The establishment, maintenance, or operation of the conditional use will not be detrimental to or endanger the public health, safety, moral comfort, or general welfare of the county.
5. X The conditional use will not be injurious to the use and enjoyment of other property in the immediate vicinity for the purpose already permitted, nor substantially diminish and impair property values

and orderly development of the surrounding property for uses permitted in the district.

6. X The establishment of conditional use will not impede the normal

within the neighborhood.

- 7. X Adequate utilities, access roads, and drainage facilities have been or are being provided.
- 8. X That adequate measures have been or will be taken to provide ingress and egress so designed as to minimize traffic congestion in the public streets.
- 9. X The use does not include noise, which is objectionable due to volume, frequency, or beat unless muffled or otherwise controlled
- 10. X The use does not involve any pollution of the air by fly-ash, dust, vapors, or other substance which is harmful to health, animals,

vegetation, or other property or which can cause soiling, discomfort, or irritation.

- 11. X The use does not involve any malodorous gas or matter, which is discernible on any adjoining lot or property.
- 12. X The use does not involve any direct or reflected glare, which is visible from any adjoining property or from any public street, road, or highway.
- 13. X The use does not involve any activity substantially increasing the movement of traffic on public streets unless procedures are instituted to limit traffic hazards and congestion.
- 14. X The use does not involve any activity substantially increasing the burden on any public utilities or facilities unless provisions are made for any necessary adjustments.
