She contacted Great Plains which did not submit a quote. Allo and Kinetic did submit quotes. Allo's quote stated no contract will be needed and they guaranteed 4-hour response service. Kinetic's quote included a 2-year contract and varied speeds. Matt Starkey, Veteran's Service Office/Public Transit Director, was present and gave information on the current problems the building is having with NextLink for their internet services.

Moved by Zabrocki and seconded by Hain to approve Allo for internet services at the West Wing Building.

The Commissioners talked about live streaming and video recording commissioner meetings. Commissioner Hain led discussion and stated she contacted Butler, Saline and York Counties which live-stream their meetings. She stated a Zoom subscription would be needed in connection with the "Owl" System the county owns. Culver stated this item was discussed eight months ago and it was decided not to proceed. He was not in favor at that time and has not changed his mind on the subject. Commissioner Schmieding gave information that he felt the same way and stated that the system we have is not reliable. Commissioner Zabrocki questioned the storage of the meeting information and stated proper equipment will be needed. Ahmic stated she agrees with transparency of information but has other concerns such as participation and picking up noise interference with the equipment we have.

Danna Seevers, a constituent, commented about wanting to have meetings livestreamed.

Alicia Alley also made a comment about the recording.

Commissioner Hain said she would like to look into more options on the subject.

Emergency Manager Gary Peterson, Sheriff Mike Vance and Chelsea Smith of the Sheriff's Office were present to talk about an upgrade to the mass notification system. Peterson said the new system would automatically upload phone numbers and thereby, notifications could reach more people. He said the cost could be split among the Emergency Management Dept. and also the Sheriff's Office. Smith reported that only approximately 2,000 people in Seward County have signed up for notifications. This upgraded system would be able to target people in a certain geographical area. They would like to have more people signed up for situations such as bad weather, active shooters, etc. Costs for the new upgrade would come out of the Sheriff Drug Fund and the Emergency Manager's Grant fund.

County Attorney Wendy Elston, Casey Tiemann, Office Manager of the Attorney's Office, and HR Director Carina Sanchez were present to discuss the Vacant Diversion Director position. Elston led discussion that she has had the position open and not received any viable applications. She would like the Commissioners to update the starting wage for the position.
