Commissioner Vrbka reported he met with constituents concerning road issues.

Commissioner Culver reported he met with the 911 director and other various officials and worked on the budget.

Commissioner Schmieding reported he attended an open house/ground breaking for a new business in Seward, hosted the Visitors Committee booth at the County Fair and worked on the budget.

Commissioner Paulsen reported she also went to an open house/ground breaking for a new business, attended the City Council meeting, met with the Seward City Engineer about Seward St. and will attend a Seward County Chamber Development Partnership meeting this evening.

Schweitzer led discussion on the claim for costs for Nolan Eickhoff for a 4-H Project on abandoned Cemeteries. He had submitted \$39.04 in actual receipts but also incurred mileage costs. At a previous meeting, the Commissioners said they would allow up to \$200.00 for costs he incurred for the project. Schweitzer asked if the Commissioners would cover costs for mileage.

Moved by Vrbka and seconded by Schmieding to pay up to \$200 for costs incurred by Nolan Eickhoff for a 4-H project for abandoned cemeteries.

Megan Kahler of Seward County BRIDGES was present to discuss the organization's activities. She explained some of the programs hosted by the organization, such as DARE, RAPP, and others, and explained where the revenue from these programs goes. She said Seward County is the sole donor. Wendy Elston, County Attorney, also gave information about the organization's resources for other communities as well.

Bob Blevins was present to represent the Seward Rural Fire District in regard to the tax request it submitted as part of the Miscellaneous Tax District Request. He gave a synopsis about the creation of the county-wide fire district and gave information about the request.

Wendy Elston led discussion on creating a County Attorney Non-Grant Fund for Interlocal Revenue and Expenses. She is asking that the funds from interlocals be included in the revenue that would be deposited in this fund. She stated the budget for interlocals would be the same amount as it was budgeted for in her grant fund. Bob Dahms, County Treasurer, made comments about funds and revenue and that other departments may also want to have funds created just like this one to keep their own revenue. She stated that her office has the ability to have interlocals and so she is asking the Commissioners to create a fund for that.

Moved by Culver and seconded by Vrbka to not approve the request to create the County Attorney Non-Grant Fund for Interlocal Revenue and Expenses.

Van Springer and Doug Brand were present for the Seward County Ag Society and explained the organization's revenue and costs. They are 1 of the 4 Misc. Districts that ask the Board of Commissioners for levy authority.

The Board discussed the amounts that they feel should be allocated for them.

Moved by Schmieding and seconded by Vrbka to adopt Resolution No. 3465 in regard to allocating the tax authority for the 4 Miscellaneous Districts.

## RESOLUTION # 3465 OF THE SEWARD COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS

WHEREAS, Pursuant to State Statute § 77-3443, each County Board shall adopt a Resolution by a majority vote of members present which determines a final allocation of levy authority to its political subdivisions, AND,

WHEREAS, political subdivisions as defined in § 77-3443 (1)(a) as "all political subdivisions <u>other</u> than school districts, community colleges, natural resource

districts, educational service units, cities, villages, counties, municipal counties, rural and suburban fire protection districts that have levy authority pursuant to subsection (10) of section 77-3442, and sanitary and improvement districts", AND,

WHEREAS, the political subdivisions may levy taxes as provided by law, provided they do not collectively total more than fifteen cents per one hundred dollars of taxable valuation on any parcel or item of taxable property for all governments for which allocations are made by the County, AND,

WHEREAS, on or before August 1st, all political subdivisions subject to county levy authority <u>must</u> submit a preliminary request for levy allocation to the County Board, AND,

WHEREAS, failure of a political subdivision to submit a preliminary request shall preclude the political subdivision from using the procedures set forth in §77-3444 to exceed the final levy allocation, AND,

WHEREAS, Seward County has four such political subdivisions, namely: Seward County

Agricultural Society, Seward County Fire District, Pleasant Dale Cemetery District and J Precinct Cemetery District, AND,

WHEREAS, the following requests were received on or before the August 1st:

Seward County Agricultural Society

Funding Request: \$ 495,000.00

Pleasant Dale Cemetery District

Funding Request: \$ 1,685.00

J Precinct Cemetery District

Funding Request: \$ 1,424.90

Seward County Fire District

Funding Request: \$ 769,315.55

and

WHEREAS, included in the above request from the Seward County Fire District was a request to include \$80,000 in Seward County's five cent levy allocation allowed by law for Interlocal Agreements, and \$94,892.50 for their Bond Fund, AND,

WHEREAS, § 77-3343 provides that the County Board shall review and approve or disapprove the funding or levy request by September  $1^{st}$  of the current year.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED: That the Seward County Board of Commissioners hereby designate the following levy allocations pursuant to Nebraska State Statute § 77-3443 as follows:

Seward County Agricultural Society: \$495,000.00
Pleasant Dale Cemetery District \$1,685.00
J Precinct Cemetery District \$1,424.90
Seward County Fire District \$769,315.55

Dahms said he did not recall the Board stating the interlocal revenue should be put in the County Attorney Grant Fund. Elston said she tries to find other sources of revenue and that the interlocal needs to be in a fund so it can be used to pay expenses. Culver said he has more questions and requested more time to look for more information.
