A regular meeting of the Seward County Board of Commissioners was convened in open and public session at 8:30 a.m. on February 7, 2023 in the Commissioner's room at the Seward County Courthouse. Notice of the meeting was posted on the Courthouse bulletin board and on the Commissioner's Room door. The agenda for all meetings is kept continually current and is available for public inspection at the County Clerk's Office during normal business hours. The agenda is held open until one business day prior to the meeting for appearance before the Board. The Board of Commissioners has the right to modify the agenda to include items of an emergency nature only at such public meeting.

The Seward County Board of Commissioners convened on February 7, 2023 at 8:30 a.m.

The Chairperson noted that the public meeting information is posted as required by law and available for public distribution if requested.

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Jonathan Jank, Executive Director of Seward County Chamber & Development Partnership, updated the Commissioners on activities of his organization.

Lauri Sherman, Executive Director of BRIDGES, updated the Commissioners on their activities this month.

Those officials who updated the Commissioners on the activities of their office were Kathy Ruzicka, Ann Dobesh, Brittney Emerson, Carrie Gottschalk and Sherry Schweitzer.

Commissioners Reports:

Commissioner Ahmic helped the Highway Supt. connect to a person that can help with tree trimming, watched Legislative hearings, attended the NIRMA Roundtable webinar, met with representatives of Maenelli Wagner & Associates with the Highway Supt., and received calls from constituents.

Commissioner Hain reported she checked out a road project on Bluff Road regarding trees, met with Road Dept. personnel during meeting, met with the Highway Supt and foremen and three school supts. She also is doing research on the County Safety Manual in regard to safety vests, etc. and she participated in a Zoom session with NIRMA and Continuum'.

Commissioner Culver reported he met with a Dept. head on legislative issues, gave information about some bills in the legislature, worked with our IT representative on a phone system proposal and a new panic button system, and will attend a meeting with auditors this coming week.

Commissioner Schmieding reported he met with the HR Director on a county matter, checked out some road conditions and has an Extension Board meeting this Wednesday. He also mentioned updates for the Arbor Day celebration.

Commissioner Zabrocki reported he attended the NIRMA Roundtable webinar, spent time with the Asst. Road Supt., checked on a road matter involving trees, attended a Highway Dept. Meeting, and will attend a Seward City Council meeting this evening.

The Commissioners discussed addressing for Bamboo Trail. Ahmic led discussion that in a previous resolution adopted last week, the numbering system for an address was incorrect. Due to that, a resolution needs to adopted amending the previous resolution.

Moved by Zabrocki and seconded by Ahmic to adopt Resolution No. 3735 in regard to amending Resolution No. 3733 pertaining to an address change.

RESOLUTION NO. <u>3735</u> SEWARD COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS

WHEREAS, on January 31, 2023, the Seward County Board of Commissioners passed Resolution No. 3733 regarding renaming a portion of 210th Road to Bamboo Trail;

WHEREAS, due to a numbering error in the unit numbers, Resolution 3733 needs to be amended;

WHEREAS, this Amended Resolution No. 3735 replaces Resolution No. 3733 in its entirety;

WHEREAS, the street address for the properties located in Section 32 Township 10 North, Range 4 East of the 6th p.m. taking access off of 210th Road were assigned the street address of "766 - 210th Road," with each residence being assigned a separate unit number as follows:

766- 210th Road, Unit 10, Milford, Nebraska 766- 210th Road, Unit 20, Milford, Nebraska

WHEREAS, on September 7, 2021, the current property owners of the residences at those addresses requested that the Seward County Board of Commissioners ("Board") rename the addresses to "Bamboo Trail"; however, the Board took no action on the request;

WHEREAS, on or about February 2, 2022, the Seward County E-911 Center and the Seward County Assessor were erroneously notified by the Seward County Zoning Administrator that the street name to the above properties had been changed to "Bamboo Trail," with each address being assigned a number:

766- 210th Road, Unit 10, was changed to 750 Bamboo Trail, Milford, Nebraska 766- 210th Road, Unit 20, was changed to 766 Bamboo Trail, Milford, Nebraska

WHEREAS, the E911 Center and Seward County Assessor updated the addresses accordingly and modified their records to reflect the Bamboo Trail addresses, and have been utilizing them since that time;

WHEREAS, in approximately March 2022, the owner(s) of the above properties notified the United States Postal Service of the above address reassignments. USPS changed the addresses without notification from the proper authorities and has been utilizing the new addresses;

WHEREAS, the property owners have changed all of their personal and official correspondence and documentation to the Bamboo Trail addresses, and have mapped the Bamboo Trail address to Google;

WHEREAS, given the period of time during which these addresses have been used in official capacities and because a portion of the change was made due to the actions of an official with Seward County, although erroneously, Seward County recognizes that it would be burdensome to and cause undue confusion and expense to revert to the prior addresses;

WHEREAS, the Seward County Zoning Regulations that were in place immediately prior to the current zoning regulations were adopted in 1996 and contained a section entitled "E-911 Addressing," which sets out the naming scheme for roads in Seward County;

WHEREAS, the current Seward County Zoning Regulations were adopted in 2007 and, whether by design or oversight, did not contain a section regarding scheme by which Seward County roads are to be named;

WHEREAS, the 2007 Zoning Regulations do not contain a section regarding addressing and do not contain a provision that repealed the 1996 E-911 Addressing section; therefore, the 1996 section still controls;

WHEREAS, as the current zoning regulations were silent on the issue of addressing and the existence of the current controlling section was not immediately apparent, the resulting address change was made out of compliance with the E-911 Addressing section, which provides:

Sec. 16: E-911 Addressing

- 1-1.2 Private Road Names All private roadways, that serve more than one residence, and that take direct access from a County Road will be designated a name or number, which shall end in "Drive" and be on a blue road sign.
- 1-1.2.3 All private roads that take access onto an East/West county road shall be given a number that will follow the County Road numbering sequence and end in "Drive."
- 1-1.2.4 All private roadways that take access onto a North/South county road shall be given a name that will end in "Drive."

WHEREAS, pursuant to the naming scheme, road names ending in "Circle, Lane, Trail, or Way" are reserved for private roadways that serve more than one residence and take access from a private roadway;

WHEREAS, the private roadway takes access off of 210th Road, which is North/South county road; therefore, the road should have been assigned a name ending in "Drive";

WHEREAS, Seward County recognizes that it would be burdensome to and cause undue confusion and expense to change the addresses to comply with the naming scheme;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Seward County Board of Commissioners hereby names the road taking access off 210th Road in Section 32 Township 10 North, Range 4 East of the 6th p.m. previously named 766 - 210th Road, as Bamboo Trail. The road name shall be posted by Seward County on a blue road sign and addresses for the existing properties are assigned as follows:

766 210th Road, Unit 10, is now 750 Bamboo Trail, Milford, Nebraska 766 210th Road, Unit 20, is now 766 Bamboo Trail, Milford, Nebraska
