During disbursement of ARPA funds discussion, Commissioner Ahmic reported she and Commissioner Vrbka went to two Fire Dept. meetings this past week to give information about the Emergency Responder in Response to Public Health payments for which the County is utilizing ARPA funding. Ahmic stated that the County Attorney suggested paying those emergency responders who qualify directly instead of paying the villages, who would have to disperse the funds to emergency responders. The Commissioners are going to the fire dept meetings to get necessary forms completed. They will be meeting with Cordova and Goehner next week. They reported they were well received by those departments they have already visited.

Ahmic stated an ARPA use for funds is Revenue Loss Replacement. The entity receiving ARPA funds is allowed to replace an amount up to \$10,000,000. The Commissioners will wait until they know how much the various villages need to complete their projects to determine how much the County can claim under this provision.

Upon Review of all necessary facts, the Seward County Board of Commissioners makes the following findings that the application is for the Installation and Use of a Telecommunications Tower, and therefore subject to Seward County's Comprehensive Plan and Land Use Matrix of the Seward County Zoning Regulations, which states:

Article 8: Section 8.01 Radio, Television and Wireless Communication towers.
8.01.01 Intent. To regulate towers, telecommunications facilities, and antennas in the county in conformance with the Communications Act without prohibiting or tending to prohibit any person from providing wireless service. Promote and encourage shared use.

Upon Review of all the necessary facts, the Seward County Board of Commissioners makes the following findings that:

1. Y The use, in all other respects, conforms to the applicable regulations of the district in which it is located.
2. Y The use has adequate water, sewer, and drainage facilities.
3. Y The use is in harmony with the character of the area and the most appropriate use of the land.
4. Y The establishment, maintenance, or operation of the conditional use will not be detrimental to or endanger the public health, safety, moral, comfort, or general welfare of the county.
5. Y The use will not be injurious to the use and enjoyment of other property in the immediate vicinity for the purpose already permitted, nor substantially diminish and impair property values within the neighborhood. No evidence of property value diminishing.
6. Y The use will not impede the normal and orderly development of the surrounding property for uses permitted in the district.
7. Y The use has adequate utilities, access roads, and drainage facilities.
8. Y That adequate measures have been or will be taken to provide ingress and egress so designed as to minimize traffic congestion in the public streets.
9. Y The use does not include noise, which is objectionable due to volume, frequency, or beat unless muffled or otherwise controlled.

10. Y The use does not involve any pollution of the air by fly-ash, dust, vapors or other substance which is harmful to health, animals, vegetation or other property or which can cause soiling, discomfort, or irritation.

11. Y The use does not involve any malodorous gas or matter, which is discernible on any adjoining lot or property

12. Y The use does not involve any direct or reflected glare, which is visible from any adjoining property or from any public street, road, or highway.

13. Y The use does not involve any activity substantially increasing the movement of traffic on public streets unless procedures are instituted to limit traffic hazards and congestion.

14. Y The use does not involve any activity substantially increasing the burden on any public utilities or facilities unless provisions are made for any necessary adjustments.

Specific Findings of fact Y Allowable in TA-1 District. Currently Zoned TA-1
 This Conditional Use Permit is applicable to the Tower Only.

Every item, dish or antenna mounted on this tower, or boxes mounted on the ground requires a Separate Development Permit Each.
