Michaela Tuttle, HR Director reported about information concerning phones with Windstream.

Chairman Glawatz led discussion on the E911 Radio Equipment Payback item on the agenda. Glawatz reported the amount paid in advance by the Inheritance Fund of Seward County was \$351,149.00 for the new radio equipment for the E911 Dept. The amount of \$35,114.90 was paid back to the Inheritance Fund by the E911 budget in June 2017, so the amount needed to be repaid back by the 3 entities, namely Seward County, the City of Seward and the City of Milford, is \$316,034.10. The amount needed to be paid, based on the interlocal % rate is:

Seward County (63%): \$199,101.49

City of Seward (33%): 104,291.25

City of Milford (4%): 12,641.36

Total of Payback to Seward County Needed: \$316,034.10

Seward County has already paid their share with their entire payment being paid out of the Inheritance Fund. It was noted that Seward County has lent the amount needed from the cities of Seward and Milford interest free.

**SEWARD COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS
Resolution # 3322**

WHEREAS, there are occasions in which a jury trial is held in the Seward County District Court, and as such, there is a need for one or more bailiffs in order to assist the Jury and the Court.

WHEREAS, Nebraska Revised Statute § 24-350 provides in part:
The judge of the district court may, if the business of the court requires, appoint a bailiff or bailiffs. In counties having not more than sixty thousand inhabitants, the appointment shall continue only so long as is necessary. Bailiffs shall receive for their services either (a) an annual salary in an amount to be fixed by the county board, payable in monthly installments from the county general fund, or (b) a per diem in an amount to be fixed by the county board, payable monthly from the county general fund.

WHEREAS, The County Board has determined that the bailiff(s) shall be paid a per diem rate, payable monthly from the county general fund.

WHEREAS, the County Board desires to pay a fair wage, not to be below the hourly State Minimum Wage at the time the work is performed.

WHEREAS, this Resolution is being made after consulting with the District Court and comparing the wage of comparable bailiff's in the local area.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT, the bailiffs appointed by the District Court Judge shall be paid a per diem wage in the amount of **\$100.00**, payable monthly from the county general fund.

FURTHER, the District Court shall keep track of the actual hours worked and a claim shall be submitted to the Seward County Payroll Department as required by County Policy/Practice, reflecting the hours worked per day. In the event that the hours worked by the bailiff(s) result in an hourly pay below the current State Minimum Wage at the time the work is performed, the Bailiff shall be paid the State Minimum Wage for hours actually worked.
