Upon review of all necessary facts, the County Commissioners make the following findings:
1. X The use, in all other respects, conforms to the applicable regulations of the district in which it is located.
2. X The use will have adequate water and sewer facilities.
3. \underline{X} The use will be in harmony with the character of the area and the most appropriate use of the land.
4. X The establishment, maintenance, or operation of the conditional use will not be detrimental to or endanger the public health, safety, moral, comfort, or general welfare of the county.
5. X The conditional use will not be injurious to the use and enjoyment of other property in the immediate vicinity for the purpose already permitted, nor substantially diminish and impair property values within the neighborhood.
6. X The establishment of conditional use will not impede the normal and orderly development of the surrounding property for uses permitted in the district.
7. X Adequate utilities, access roads, and drainage facilities have been or are being provided.
8. X That adequate measures have been or will be taken to provide ingress and egress so designed as to minimize traffic congestion in the public streets.
9. X The use does not include noise, which is objectionable due to volume, frequency, or beat unless muffled or otherwise controlled
10. X The use does not involve any pollution of the air by fly-ash, dust, vapors, or other substance which is harmful to health, animals, vegetation, or other property or which can cause soiling, discomfort, or irritation.
11. X The use does not involve any malodorous gas or matter, which is discernible on any adjoining lot or property.
12. X The use does not involve any direct or reflected glare, which is visible from any adjoining property or from any public street, road, or highway.
13. X The use does not involve any activity substantially increasing the movement of traffic on public streets unless procedures are instituted to limit traffic hazards and congestion.
14. X The use does not involve any activity substantially increasing the burden on any public utilities or facilities unless provisions are made for any necessary adjustments.
Further, the County Commissioners recommend the following specific conditions that are necessary or desirable to address the most appropriate use of the land, the conservation and stabilization of the value of property, the provision of adequate open space for light and air, concentration of populations, congestion of public streets, and the promotion of the general health, safety, welfare, convenience, and comfort of the public: Permit granted to current owner – any changes will require a new application.

Regarding appointing a member to the Aging Services Advisory Board Member item on the agenda, Commissioner Hain reported that the two individuals who had applied for the Aging Services Advisory Board have withdrawn their applications. She stated that due to time commitments, they felt they could not contribute at this time. No further action was taken at this time.

Commissioner Ahmic led discussion on the agenda item Burlington Northern Santa Fe (BNSF) Incentive for a Milford Crossing Closure. She stated she has worked for almost three years about closing a railroad crossing northeast of Milford due to not being able to find a consistent contact person from BNSF to work with. Although it would also close two farm entrances, a new farm crossing would need to be constructed due to the topography of the area. Funds given to entities for closing a crossing are usually \$100,000 from the railroad and \$100,000 from the State of Nebraska. She said the railroad has offered only \$30,000 due to the closing would only affect farm crossings and no public roads. She is not sure if the State of Nebraska would offer any funds. The county does not want any costs related to closing this crossing and currently, the costs for making the new farm crossing would be more than the county would receive. Highway Supt., Jon Regnier gave a sample of what he would make for a farm crossing and estimated costs to be \$50,000. She has talked to Senator Hughes about this and will be talking to someone at the state level to find out their funding.

During Legislative Update, Commissioner Ahmic stated LB 468, the Inheritance Tax bill, would probably be debated today. This bill would diminish Inheritance Tax funds to the counties but has replacement revenue in it, so a close watch was advised.

Human Resources Director, Roxanne Knutson and Assistant Human Resources Director, Tiffany Allen were present to discuss the wage adjustments and merit increases for Seward County employees FY 25-26.

Moved by Pekarek and seconded by Schmieding to approve the following starting wages effective July 1, 2025 with current employees to be eligible to receive a merit raise of up to 3% and will receive the difference from the new to the old starting wages in their position.
